HOSPITAL VISIT

Objective: To understand the organization and structure of a hospital pharmacy, including its role in patient care. Observe the procurement, storage, and dispensing of medications in accordance with hospital policies and regulatory standards. Learn about the clinical pharmacist's role in medication therapy management, including patient counselling, drug interactions, and adverse drug reaction (ADR) monitoring.

A visit to Sahyadri Hospital, Karad was arranged at 2nd August 2025 for the students of IInd year D. Pharm of Yashoda Technical Campus, Satara. Around 47 students along with 2 faculty members had visited the hospital.

The visit started at 10.30 am from the College. We boarded with the college bus to reach Karad. We reached there around 12.00 noon. At the reception, we were welcomed by the team members of Sahyadri Hospital. The students visited the different departments of the hospital like ICU, ICCU, In-Patient Pharmacy, Out-patient pharmacy, canteen, pathology lab, CATH Lab, operation theatres, emergency services etc. A detailed explanation regarding each department was given during the visit. This was followed by a detailed presentation about the role of hospital pharmacy in hospital, drug distribution systems, inventory management and medication errors.

In the end, we visited the In-Patient pharmacy store, where we had a chance to see the actual storage, purchasing and billing of drugs to patients. We also saw the special precautions for storage of narcotic drugs. Overall, the visit was very informative and enjoyable. We came to know regarding the role of Hospital Pharmacist in the overall health management.

This field visit was successfully completed under the valuable guidance of President Prof. Dasharath Sagare, Vice-President Prof. Ajinkya Sagare, and Principal Dr. V. K. Redasani. HOD Prof. A.T. Thorat.

Outcome: Student learned how medications are procured, stored, and dispensed following safety and regulatory standards. Students observed the clinical pharmacist's role in monitoring drug therapy, patient counseling, and reporting adverse drug reactions. This experience helped bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world hospital practices, enhancing their confidence in handling pharmaceutical responsibilities. Overall,

the visit improved their knowledge of rational drug use, documentation, and multidisciplinary healthcare teamwork.

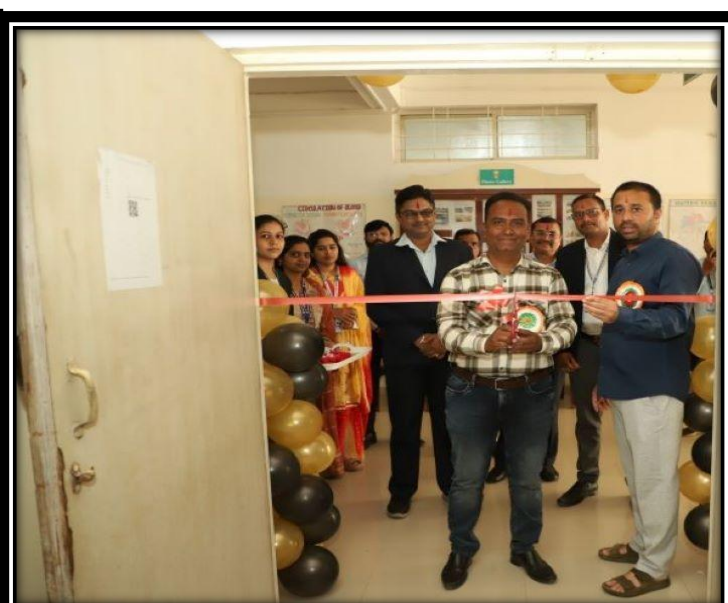
Report On World Pharmacist Day Celebration

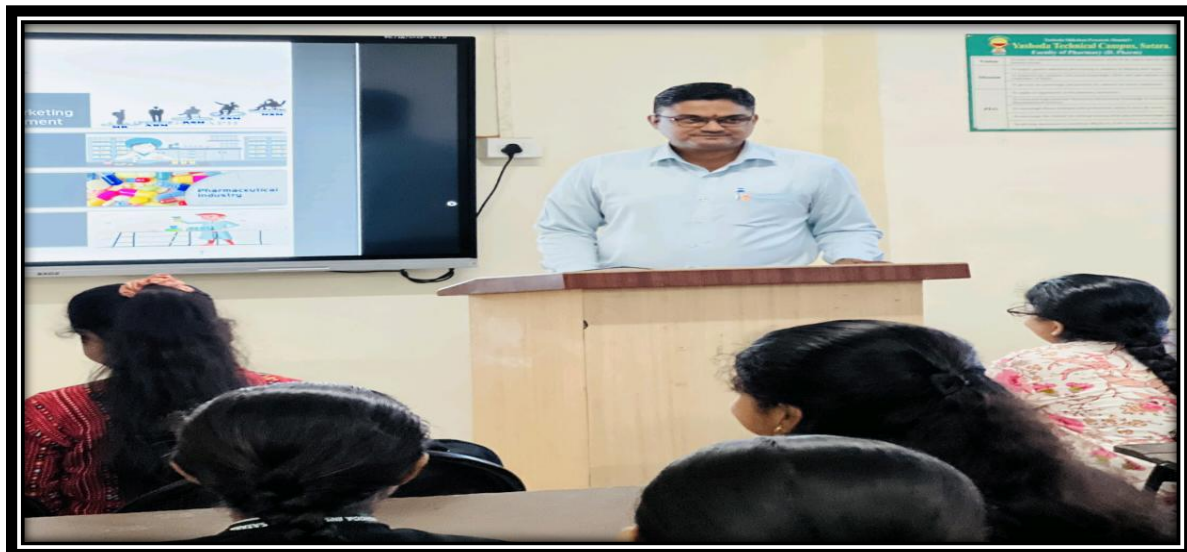

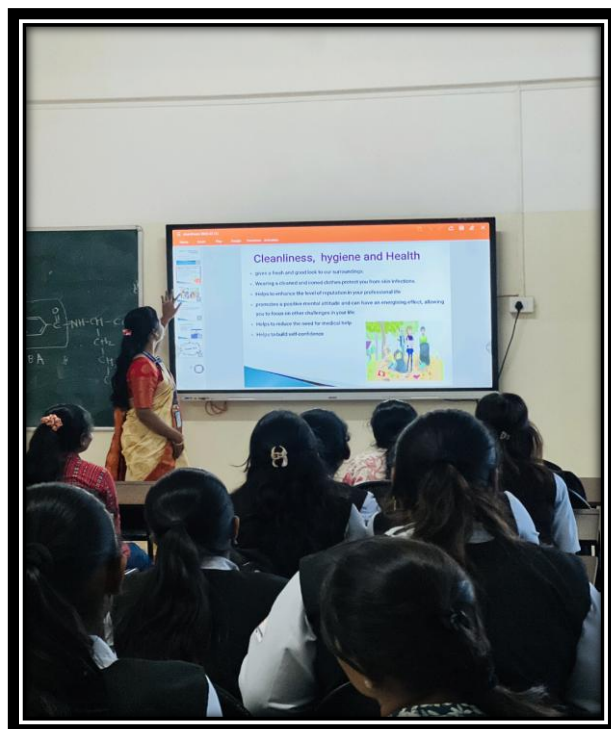

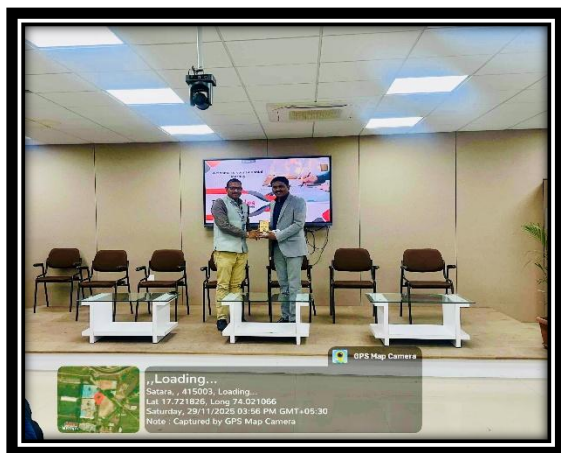


One Day FDP on Financial Wellness

The speaker delivered an engaging and interactive session covering the following key modules: Financial Fundamentals: Differentiating between Saving and Investing, understanding Inflation and the need for wealth creation, and illustrating the Power of Compounding. Investment Avenues: A practical overview of various options, including Equity Shares, Mutual Funds (focus on SIPs), and Fixed Income instruments, highlighting the risk-return trade-off. Market Mechanics: Explaining the role of the Stock Exchange (BSE/NSE), Depositories (NSDL/CDSL), and the necessity of Demat and Trading Accounts. Investor Protection & Frauds: The crucial role of SEBI as a regulator. Practical tips to avoid financial scams, recognizing unauthorized schemes, and the process of grievance redressal (e.g., SEBI SCORES). *

The lecture utilized a dynamic presentation style incorporating real-life examples, case studies of investment pitfalls, and simplified analogies to demystify complex financial jargon. A significant portion of the session was dedicated to an interactive Q&A, where attendees posed queries regarding SIP calculations, cryptocurrency regulation, and steps to verify intermediaries.

The guest lecture was a highly successful initiative in financial awareness. The speaker effectively combined theoretical knowledge with practical safeguards, empowering the audience to approach investing responsibly.

Field Visit at Charak Agencies, Satara

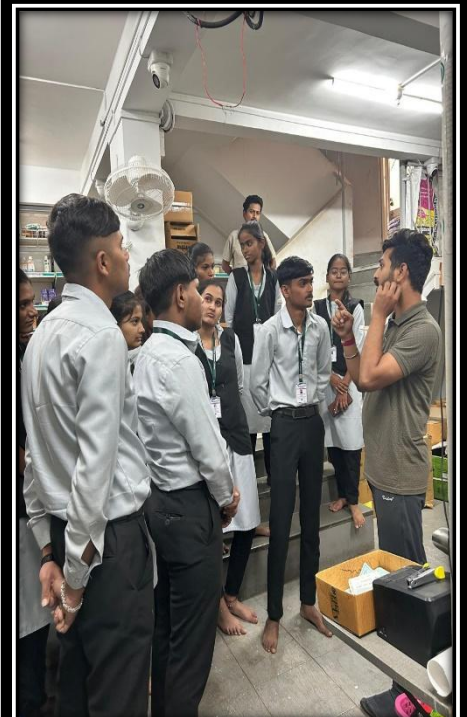
Objective of Visit: - To understand traditional systems of medicines and availability of various dosage forms and their labelling requirements.

Field Visit at PHC, Padali

Objectives of the Visit

1. To understand the functioning and services provided by a Primary Health Centre.
2. To gain practical knowledge about primary healthcare delivery at the community level.
3. To study the role of pharmacists in medication dispensing, patient counseling, and rational drug use.

A Primary Health Centre (PHC) is the first point of contact for individuals seeking healthcare services. It provides essential medical care, including preventive, diagnostic, and therapeutic services, with a focus on improving community health and wellbeing.

She also informed that the PHC caters to a population of approximately 5000 people.

During the visit, students were taken to various departments such as the vaccination room, TB section, general ward, neonatal care unit, and pharmacy section. They were also introduced to different records and registers maintained at the PHC for effective healthcare management. Additionally, the Medical Officer explained various government health schemes (Yojanas) implemented at the PHC, such as Chiranjeevi Yojana, Janani Suraksha Yojana, and PM-JAY, which aim to improve healthcare accessibility and maternal and child health outcomes.

3. To develop an understanding of the importance of conserving water resources and protecting the environment.

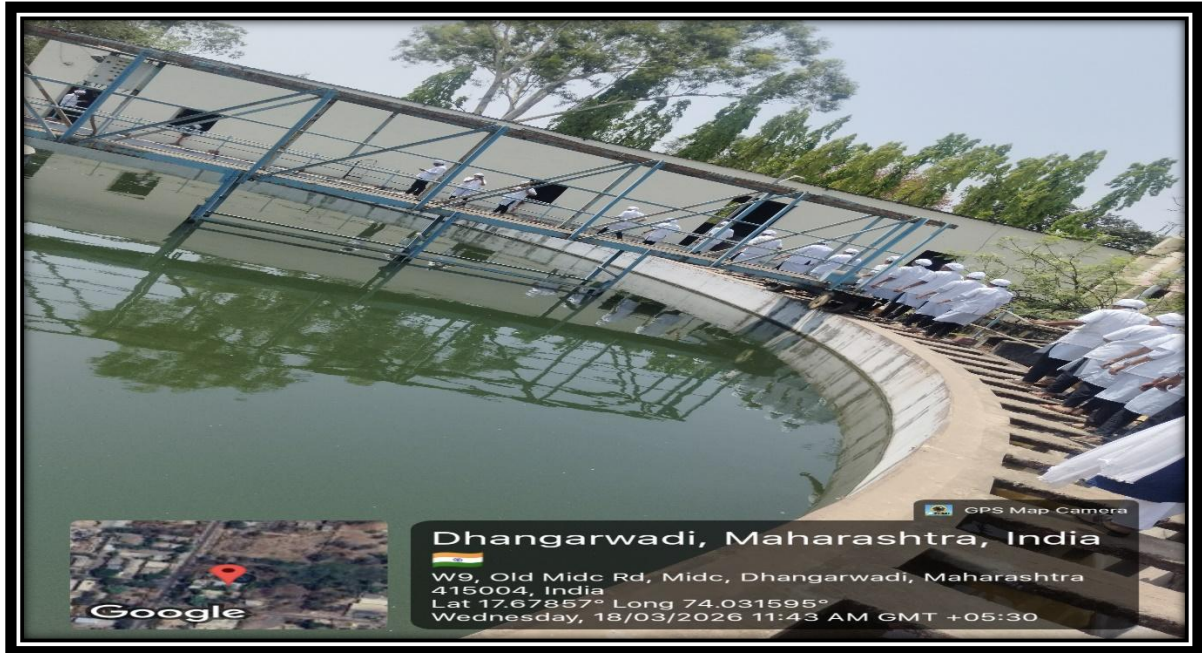
YSPM's YTC, Department of Diploma in Pharmacy organized a field visit to the Water Treatment Plant at the Deputy Engineer Office, MIDC, Satara on 18th March 2026 for First Year D. Pharm students. Around 40 students participated in the visit under the guidance of Mrs. P. A. Kadam and Mrs. A. A. Nikam.

The main objectives of the visit were to understand the importance of safe water supply, study the process of water treatment, and create awareness about water conservation.

The visit started at 11:00 am and was guided by Mr. Vinayak Kadam and Mrs. Shilpa Sakunde. Students observed different stages of water treatment, starting from the collection of raw water from the Krishna River. The water was treated with alum and bentonite (during rainy season), followed by flocculation in a clariflocculator where sludge was formed and removed. Further purification was carried out through sedimentation and sand filtration. Finally, chlorination was done for disinfection before storing the treated water in a reservoir for distribution.

The visit provided practical knowledge about large-scale water purification and highlighted the importance of clean water for human health. It also created awareness about the efforts required to supply safe water to the community. The visit concluded at 12:30 pm with a group photograph.

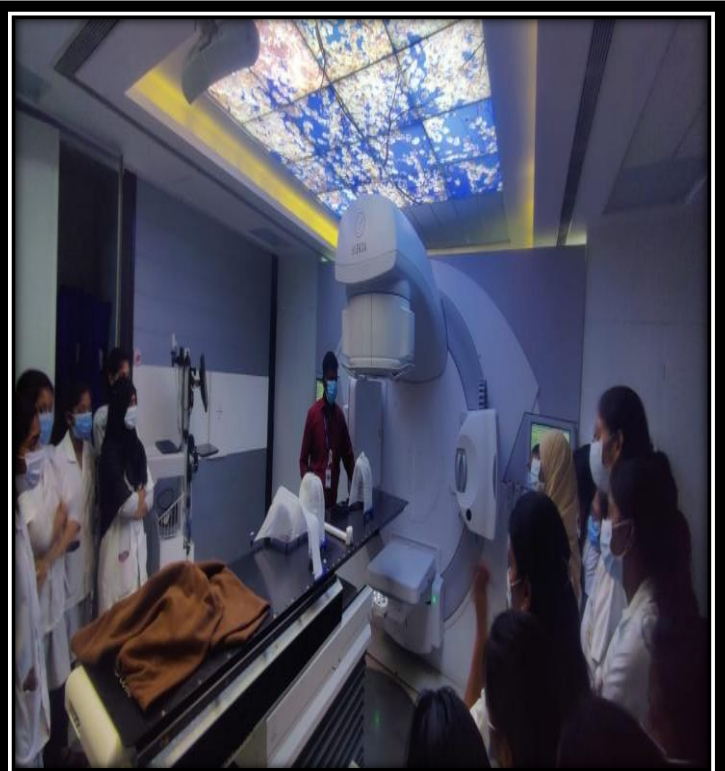
